<p>Please Share</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Registration is scheduled to begin on March 6th for spring and summer general programs, spring skating and swimming lessons and summer camps. • As a result of the new Child Care and Early Years Act (CCEYA, 2014) Community Recreation can no longer offer full or half-day camp programs for children under 4 years of age (48 months). Children must be 4 years (48 months) of age on the first day of camp. No exceptions can be made. • NEW: Duplicate Registration Policy - Community Recreation Branch has developed a new Duplicate Program Registrations Policy. Beginning in the spring 2016 session, participants may not be registered for more than one program that occurs at the same time. Customer Service staff will contact participants registered in duplicate programs prior to the start of the season to confirm which program registrants plan to attend and withdraw the client from the other program(s) that occur at the same time. • UPDATE: Participant Attendance Policy - The Participant Attendance Policy has been updated and addresses the issue of registrants who miss the first two classes and have not notified staff. Registrants who do not attend the first two classes and have not notified us will be contacted and if no information is provided, will be withdrawn from the program. Program participants are asked to ensure we have their current contact info and are reminded that "if you can't go, let us know" so we can maximize participation in our programs.



	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Effective spring session 2016 there will be a 2% fee increase on all registered programs, membership fees, punch cards and passports as well as pay as you go passes, court rental fees and point of sale items. The fee increase is a result of the City of Toronto's approved 2016 budget. The new fees <u>are not</u> reflected in the print or electronic version of the FUN Guide as the fee increase was not approved at the time of printing.
